During the workshop, school teams will work together to identify and evaluate present partnership activities using the six types of involvement: parenting, communicating, volunteering, learning at home, decision making, and collaborating with the community. This information will be used by each school to write a One-Year Action Plan linked to your school goals. **This plan will meet the family involvement requirements for No Child Left Behind.**
